	Clean Grilles & Insect Screens	Regular care and maintenance of Andersen® insect screens and grilles is recommended. Use a mild detergent and a soft cloth or brush. After cleaning, thoroughly rinse to remove all soap residue.

	Lubricate Hardware	For years of trouble-free operation use light oil or dry lubricant to keep your products functioning perfectly.
	Clean Exterior of Window	Remove dust, dirt, smoke, film, soot and salt spray from the outside of your window using a mild detergent and water solution and a soft cloth or brush.
	Touch up Scratches in Paint	Inspect the surfaces of your windows and patio doors and take this time to touch up any scratches with our color matched convenient touch-up paints.
	Clean Gliding Patio Door Track	Operate the gliding door panel. If it does not move with ease the patio door rollers may need to be adjusted, cleaned and lubricated with dry lubricant. Also inspect and clean the door track.
